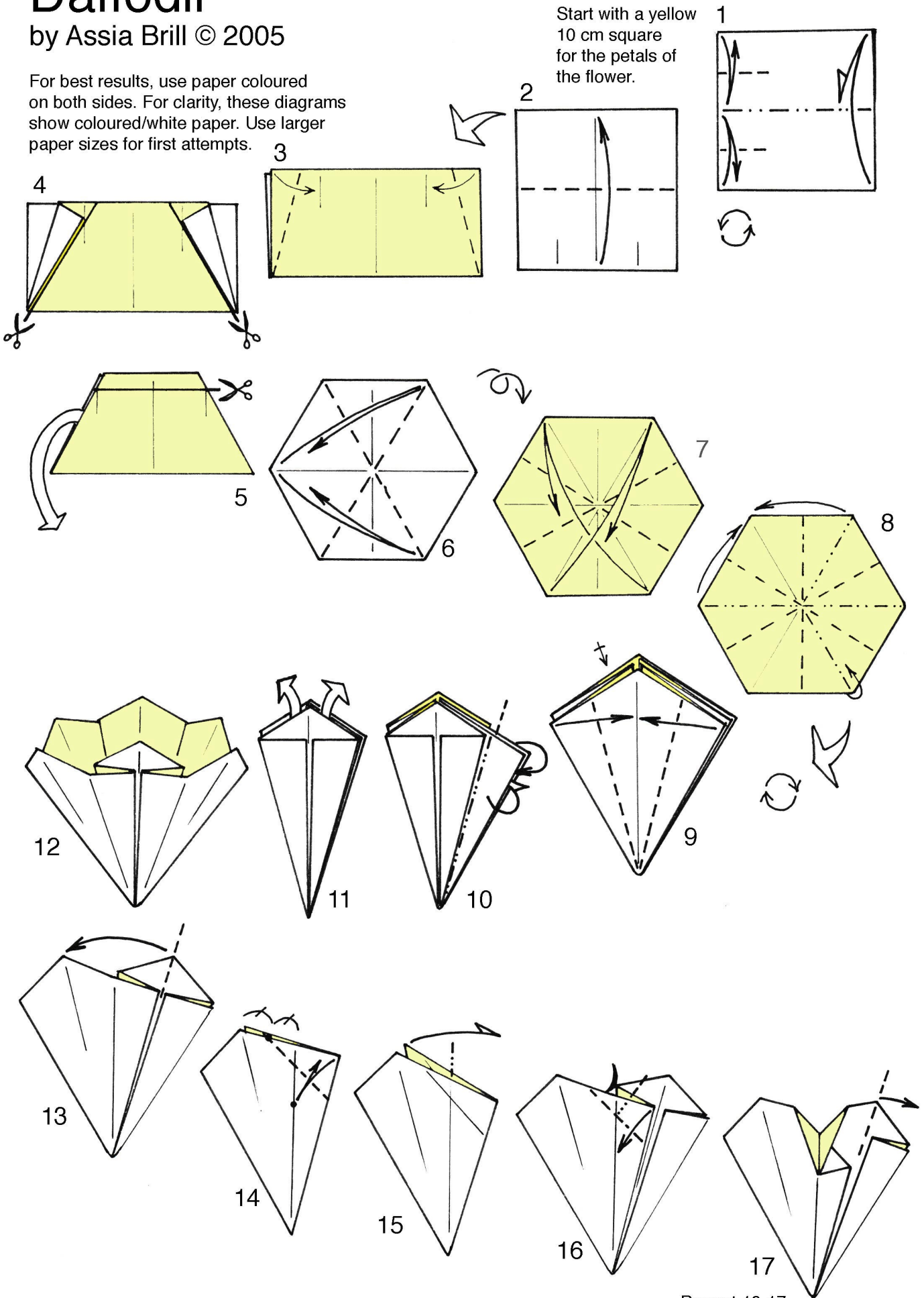


# Daffodil

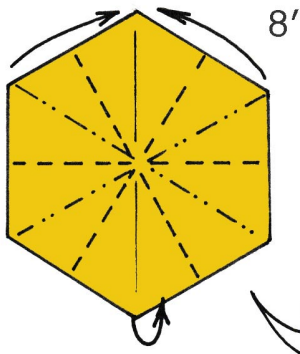

For best results, use paper coloured on both sides. For clarity, these diagrams show coloured/white paper. Use larger paper sizes for first attempts.

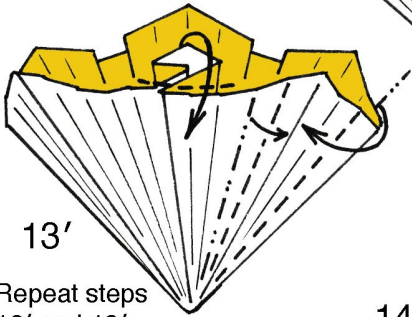
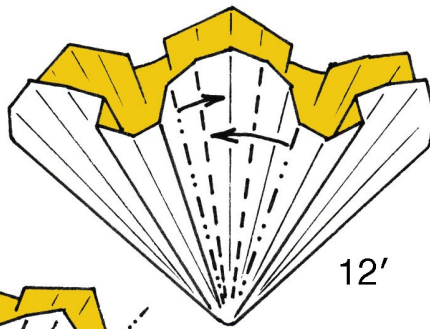
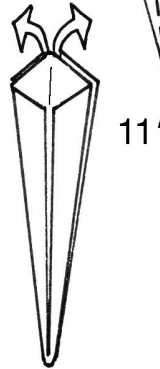
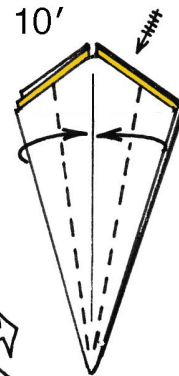
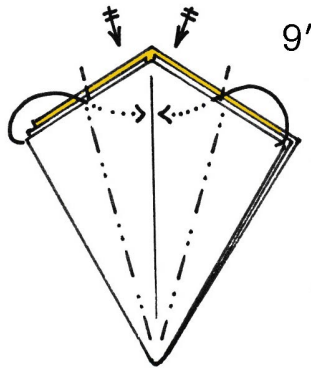
Start with a yellow 10 cm square for the petals of the flower.



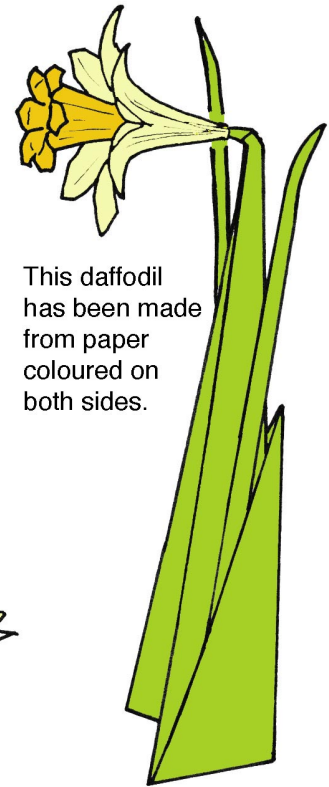
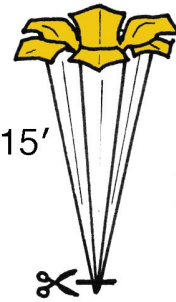
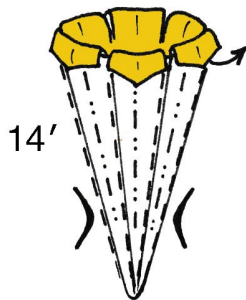
Repeat 13-17 symmetrically.



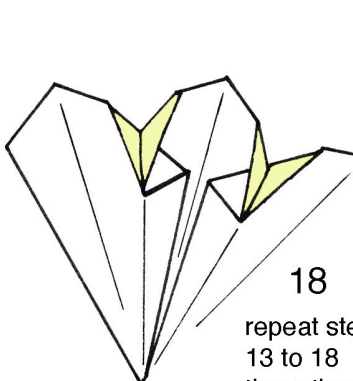
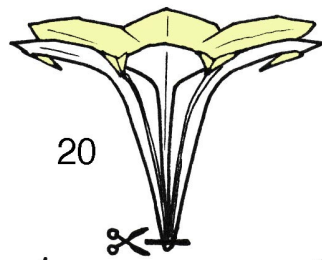
For the trumpet, use darker yellow paper to make a second hexagon from another 10 cm square. See steps 1-7.



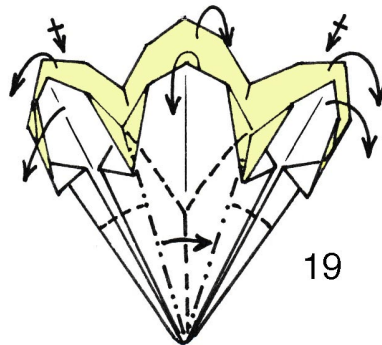
Repeat steps 12' and 13' five times.



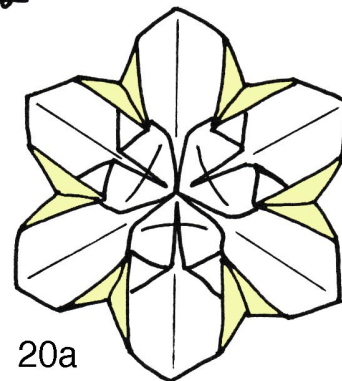
This daffodil has been made from paper coloured on both sides.
